A Message from the Chairman

This past year has been another busy one for Felix Fund. Key to our strategy is to maintain and, where necessary, strengthen the bonds already established across the Defence EOD and search community. To that end, the board of trustees is happy to announce that it has been joined by two new representatives from the Royal Navy Clearance Diver community. Commander Al Nekrews QGM, Commanding Officer of the Royal Navy Fleet Diving Squadron and Mr David Hunkin OBE (former Royal Navy Clearance Diver) are central to nurturing our support to serving Clearance Divers and to those who have subsequently joined civilian life.

Our 'Dashboard' Mental Health Resilience program continues to go from strength to strength. Felix Fund currently runs 10 courses per year, enabling in excess of 100 individuals to benefit from instruction and guidance that provides tools and techniques to allow students to recognise signs of stress and other mental health related issues. The aim is for individuals to equip themselves with the ability to tackle potential negative signposts in the early stages ('prevention' rather than 'cure'). The program has been opened to veterans as well as serving personnel, bringing a new and positive dynamic to the training that has already helped many people. It is now standard practice to have a mixture of veterans and serving personnel on each course from across the EOD and Search diaspora. We are constantly asked about the possibility of establishing similar courses for dependents and this is certainly an area we will continue to investigate in the coming year.

The onset of Coronavirus has also identified a need to be innovative; to expand the scope of delivery of Dashboard beyond the residential. To ensure Felix Fund remains able to help, a video based course of instruction has been developed which aims to mitigate the restrictions caused by 'lockdown' but also has great potential post-COVID as a medium for reaching those who cannot readily attend residential courses (such as those on operational tours).

Felix Fund is constantly evolving, and 2019 is no exception. An ever-increasing tempo set against a challenging fundraising climate requires an ability to actively respond, deliver outputs and maintain hard one credibility. Accordingly, we were pleased to be joined by Hayley Paintin this year as our new Fundraising Assistant. She, along with our CEO, Melanie Moughton, has been working tirelessly to progress Felix Fund's level of assistance to the EOD and Search community, for which it is called upon to provide annually. Focused fundraising initiatives and widening the charity's reach through new avenues of communication are but two areas they have been working on.

The fundraising support Felix Fund continues to receive from the EOD and Search community (as well as those from elsewhere) is critical. It enables the charity to deliver on its objectives and to generate more help to those who need it each year. Throughout, Felix Fund will respond to charitable need in a customarily surgical and timely fashion, as it has done since inception.

2021 will see Felix Fund reach a milestone; it's 10th Anniversary. This is a fantastic achievement by any standard and is in no small part due to the solid involvement of the community at large in raising funds. Covid-19 notwithstanding, the team is planning a number of events and activities to mark the celebrations and we sincerely hope many of you will be able to join us.

Thank you as always for your continued support as we head into another busy and productive year for Felix Fund.

Who we Are

Felix Fund the bomb disposal charity exists to provide help to any military from across all three services and SO15 (Metropolitan Police Counter Terror Unit) personnel who have conducted or assisted with Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) and Search duties.

The charity provides welfare support and financial assistance to serving personnel, veterans and their dependents.

Founded in 2011 Felix Fund operates across the UK.

Our Work

Mindfulness & Awareness

Felix Fund has been running its Dashboard programme since 2016 with excellent results. This course which delivers preventative stress training based on mindfulness provides serving military and veterans with the tools and techniques to recognise warning signs of stress and to be able to develop their ability to relax, clear their minds and focus on positive aspects of their life. This will then feedback into a more productive and positive work and home environment.

"My life has honestly changed. I have no built-up anger and can communicate with my wife without arguments. I am far more considerate of others. It has made such a difference."

"This is the only course I have ever attended where I paid full attention throughout. No heavy eyelids in the afternoon for the only time in my life! Thank you for this, it has made the world of difference to me and my family."

Financial Support

The other aspect of Felix Fund's work is financial assistance to serving personnel, veterans and their dependents, when they find themselves in times of need. This help is wide ranging from hydrotherapy treatment for a former soldier suffering from PTSD and sleep deprivation, a specially adapted buggy for the disabled son of a serving soldier to enable him to start school and go out with his family, and sporting equipment for two former Sappers to allow them to train for and compete in the Invictus Games.

We have also helped with home adaptations for veterans, such as replacement windows, the installation of stairlifts and specialist furniture to ensure they are able to remain in their own homes.









How we have Helped

Once again, the focus for Felix Fund has been the increasing issues of poor mental health amongst serving personnel and veterans. Our preventative stress training based on mindfulness has continued to evolve and again we ran several courses, very successfully for serving military and those no longer serving.

In 2019-20, 8 'Dashboard' courses were run with ten+ delegates on each course. Attendance ranged across the rank structure and as word has spread interest was gained across the wider EOD and Search community including the Royal Navy and SO15.

We opened the courses to veterans, having intended to run a veteran's only course, however, this did not happen, and we ran a mixed course which worked far better.

Ten courses are currently planned for 2020 which will run across the calendar year enabling a further 100 individuals to benefit.

Alongside the mindfulness programme Felix Fund has continued to provide financial assistance to serving military, veterans and their family members, when facing hardship.

Recent examples of help during this financial year has included:

Funding towards the purchase of a new SmartDrive wheelchair for a former Royal Engineer. After leaving the Army, he had a motorbike accident in 2017 which left him paraplegic. In order to give him a far better quality of life he needed a motorised adaption to his wheelchair. Clearly not a cheap undertaking so his family, with help from Felix Fund and other good causes were able to raise the £5,300 needed. With this motorised adaption, he has new found freedom and can travel some distance in his wheelchair, without struggle.

Covering the costs for specialist counselling for a former soldier with PTSD and anger management issues.

Purchasing a riser recliner chair for a former soldier to aid his comfort at home as he recovers from surgery.

Assistance for a soldier to fly home unexpectedly to attend his father's funeral after he had died very suddenly.

Help towards travel costs and parking fees for a young soldier's family visiting their young daughter who was in hospital for long periods.

Felix Fund prides itself on how quickly we can react to request for help and have even been able to turn a grant request around within 24 hours. For a small charity we have made a significant difference to the community we serve.


