Mindfulness and Awareness

Did you know ...



The time it takes on average, for a Veteran to ask for mental health support

Of Veterans with psychological wounds say they have never reached out for support

Of Veterans say that the reason they delay seeking help is because they fear being treated differently by friends

Of Veterans are unsure as to the support that is available

Of Veterans say they have mistrust in civilian services

Within the wider Explosive Ordnance Disposal and Search community the levels of stress and other mental health issues are particularly high. Not just following their experiences in Iraq and Afghanistan but the day to day nature of the roles they carry out have a big impact on those serving and their family members. Many keep quiet suffering in silence.

Felix Fund's Dashboard programme provides individuals with tools and techniques which will enable them to recognise warning signs of stress and other mental health illnesses and to allow them to develop their ability to relax, clear their minds and focus on the positive aspects of their life. This will then feedback into a more productive and stress reduced work and home environment.

Running since early 2016 the Dashboard courses have proved very effective with over 300 people having attended. The key is a totally relaxed environment away from work and home stresses, where individuals can focus on themselves. The two civilian trainers are totally committed to helping this unique group of men and women and we are now looking at rolling out this programme to the whole reach of Felix Fund, that means all three services plus the Metropolitan Police's Counter Terror Unit.

The course is not stand alone, it can be used as a signposting mechanism for additional help from Welfare Officers, medical practitioners or other charity programmes where necessary. Aimed at all ranks, ages and regardless of where they are in their military career it has helped to break down barriers, formed tighter working relationships and enabled many people to realise what effects their personal lives and work environment can have on their own mental health.

A carefully selected team of maturing oars people rowed the 1895 double skiff 'Tara' from Cookham to Oxford and back to Henley – a distance of 110 miles with 33 locks to navigate in aid of Felix Fund back in early June. The challenge lasted 8 days and CEO, Melanie Moughton met them in Oxford before they headed back down stream where they met with an unfortunate incident at Sandford Lock, the boat capsized in the lock. All were safe and well other than some minor damage to the 'Tara' and some lost personal belongings. Final totals are not yet in, but it is looking like they have raised over £6,000. A big thank you to Robin Hope, all the oarsmen and women and everyone who supported their efforts.


MAKE YOUR DONATIONS GO FURTHER!

Some examples of how we have helped over recent months are:

Specialist counselling for a former soldier with PTSD and anger management issues.

A riser recliner chair for a former soldier to aid his comfort at home as he recovers from surgery.

Assistance for a soldier to fly home unexpectedly to attend his father's funeral after he had died very suddenly.

Help towards travel costs and parking fees for a young soldier's family visiting their young daughter who was in hospital for long periods.

Garden of Remembrance

A garden of remembrance has opened in the grounds of the Defence Explosive Ordnance Disposal, Munitions and Search (DEMS) Training Regiment based in Bicester. It is the first memorial in the UK dedicated to both Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) and Search.

The two distinct services have worked together for over 70 years, allied together in their efforts to locate, secure and save lives.

826 EOD and Search personnel have lost their lives performing their duty, protecting others from enemy explosives and hundreds more have been wounded, forced to live with life-changing injuries as a result of their work.

The garden of remembrance offers a place to remember and reflect and was officially opened in front of specially invited guests from all three branches of the forces, and by the man whose idea it was, Major (Retired) Carl Tomlinson from the Royal Engineers;

"I'd like families to take advantage of it. I know it's behind the wire, but it's nothing a simple phone call can't resolve. It also gives the regiment their own private garden. For the instructors here who are still serving, it's somewhere for them to come and take five minutes out."

Felix Fund was pleased to support this venture in order to ensure those who gave their lives are remembered for many years to come.
